

What do you do if...

1. You are standing at the net post monitoring a match where one of the players is beginning to lose control of her emotions but has not yet done anything to warrant a code violation. Her coach approaches you mid game and says he wants to go out and calm his player down before she explodes. He invites you to stand nearby to make sure he doesn't do any coaching.
2. You check a team's challenge match sheets prior to the team introductions & you notice that a player is listed at 3rd singles that does not appear on the singles ladder
3. A coach approaches you and asks you to monitor a particular match because the players are having a lot of problems with line calls. You move down to that court and stay for a couple of games then move on. Ten minutes later he approaches you again and asks you to go back and stay on that match.
4. Same - This time both coaches return & ask if they can get a neutral spectator to monitor the match since you can't devote all of your time to that one court.
5. Same scenario. This time he suggests that he and the other coach go out and stand at the net posts but says that the other coach refuses to do so.
6. A player misses a shot that ends a game and takes the ball and slams it into the fence in disgust.
7. A player misses an easy shot and throws his racquet into the net in anger. The racquet rebounds off the net and accidentally hits his opponent.
8. A player hits a return of serve out and shouts "Only an idiot could miss such an easy serve!"
9. A player screams "God Damn it" after losing a key point. How about screaming "Oh my God" after almost every point that he loses
10. A match is over and you are headed for your car. A player who you gave a code violation to approaches you and begins complaining about your decision and using abusive language.
11. The match is tied 2-2 and the final match splits sets. It is starting to get dark and both coaches request that a 10 point match tie-break be played in lieu of a 3rd set.
12. The match score is 3-0 and the other 2 matches have just split sets. The winning coach wants to split the point for the 2 remaining matches, but the other coach wants to play them out.
